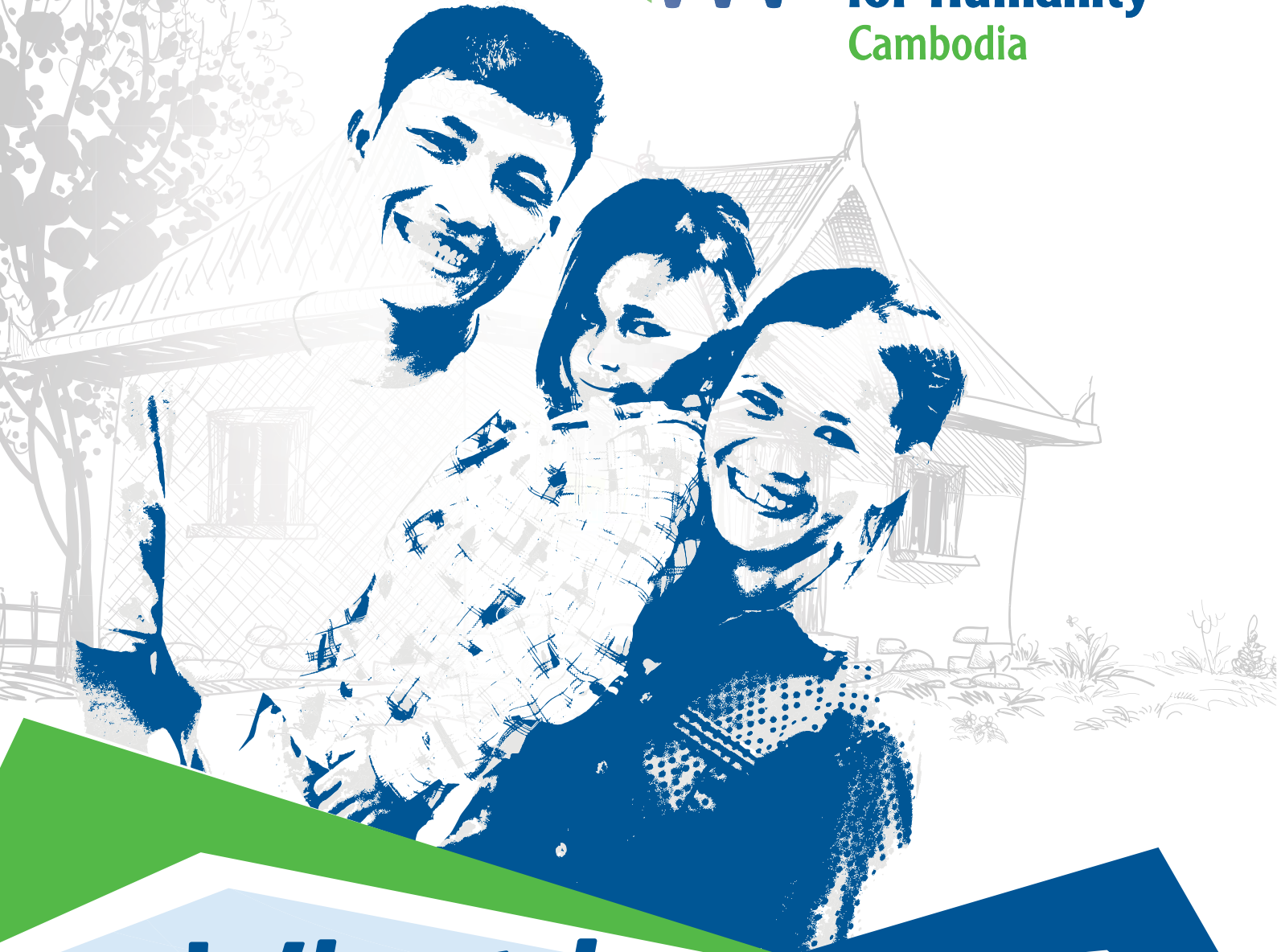

It has been an extraordinary year, full of challenges but also hope for the future. We have faced difficulties. However, with support from across the globe, we worked very hard in overcoming the challenges and taken great strides in extending the reach of our programmes to over 2,000 families in the past fiscal year through various construction interventions.

Our market development-housing finance program continues to grow with our new partnerships with Kredit Microfinance Institution, VisionFund, First Finance Plc. and Sovanna Phoum Organization.

Our land rights and housing advocacy program gained new supporters in Clifford Chance, Australian Aid through Habitat for Humanity Australia and Habitat for Humanity Canada through its Global Neighbors Program.

The Mekong Big Build, amidst various challenges, was successfully executed and our international volunteers could not be more proud of what they have all accomplished in building the first phase of



Smile Village. We have also successfully elevated our local volunteer engagement, mobilizing more than 1,200 volunteers in this year's Habitat Youth Build.

We also successfully hosted another Hope Journey headed by our water and sanitation project donor and Habitat for Humanity International Board Member Scot Sellers.

This year served as an important reminder for us to be humble and to continue to put our faith into action despite challenges. Of course, we also could not continue to assist families in Cambodia without the dedicated support of our donors, and we are grateful for your continued encouragement.

We welcome the new year with renewed fervor and a strong commitment to reaching new heights in building impact and lasting positive change within families and communities.

1 Demonstrate the love of Jesus Christ

2 Focus on shelter

We have chosen, as our means of manifesting God's love, to create opportunities for all people to live in decent, durable shelter. We put faith into action by helping to build, renovate or preserve homes, and by partnering with others to accelerate and broaden access to affordable housing as a foundation for breaking the cycle of poverty.

3 Advocate for affordable housing

In response to the prophet Micah's call to do justice, to love mercy and to walk humbly with God, we promote decent, affordable housing for all, and we support the global community's commitment to housing as a basic human right. We will advocate for just and fair housing policy to eliminate the constraints that contribute to poverty housing. And, in all of our work, we will seek to put shelter on hearts and minds in such powerful ways that poverty housing becomes socially, politically and religiously unacceptable.

4 Promote dignity and hope

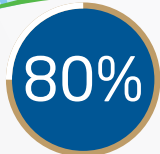

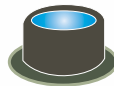
